What is the Segal AmeriCorps Education Award?

The Segal AmeriCorps Education Award is a post-service benefit earned by individuals who successfully complete terms of national service in approved AmeriCorps programs. **The award can be used towards education**.

And...

A payment of **accrued interest** for qualified federal educational loans through the National Service Trust (only for loans placed and accepted into National Service Forbearance).

And...

Federal education loans are eligible for **National Service Forbearance**. This means you do not have to pay on your federal education loans while serving.







When will I receive my Education Award?

The Segal Education Award becomes available in your MyAmeriCorps portal <u>30-60 days</u> after we have everything we need from you to process your exit from the program, such as:

- Your final approved OnCorps timesheet.
- Your completed PDP and its requirements.
- Your Leave Behind Documentation.
- Your completed and signed End-of-Term Evaluation.
- Documentation showing you completed New Member Orientation & Life After AmeriCorps training.
- Etc.

So, it really depends on you!





How much is the award?

Members are eligible to receive the education award amount associated with their slot type.

Slot Types:

- Full-Time (FT) (1,700 hours)
- Three-Quarter-Time (TQT) (1,200 hours)
- Half-Time (HT) (900 hours)
- Reduced-Half-Time (RHT) (675 hours)
- Quarter-Time (QT) (450 hours)
- Minimum-Time (MT) (300 hours)

Education Award Limitations

You can only earn an equivalent of 2 full-time (1700-hour) education awards in your lifetime.

Your award equivalent is calculated based on the value of a full-time award for the fiscal year (FY) in which it was approved.

You all have a similar looking table in your Member Service Agreement. All of you serving in the 2024-2025 service term had your positions and education award amounts approved in FY 2024.

The education awards have dollar amounts associated with them, yes, but equally important, they also have full-time education award equivalent values. This becomes important if you are (1) motivated by the education award and (2) interested in serving multiple AmeriCorps service terms.

Let's look at two examples.

The Full-Time Education Award amount for Fiscal Year 2025, which is the 2025-2026 service term is \$7,395.00. Hannah has only completed 2 terms and is enrolling in a third term (under the 4-term limit). Of the 2 terms Hannah has completed, she has been awarded \$6,635.76 (= \$1,459.26 + \$5,176.50) and has earned **0.912** (= 0.212 + 0.7) full-time education award equivalents.

A TQT position is 0.7 of a full-time education award equivalent. Adding 0.7 to Hannah's currently earned 0.912 equivalents gives 1.612, which is less than the 2 full-time education award equivalents an individual can earn.

Therefore, Hannah will receive 0.7 full-time education award equivalents for 2025-2026, or \$5,176.50 (= 0.7 x \$7,395.00), which is the full education award amount for a TQT position.

The Full-Time Education Award amount for Fiscal Year 2025, which is the 2025-2026 service term is \$7,395.00. Kevin has completed 3 AmeriCorps terms (under the 4-term limit). Of the 3 terms that Kevin has completed, he has been awarded \$13,250.50 (= \$3,247.50 + \$4,826.50 + \$5,176.50) and has earned 1.9 (= 0.5 + 0.7 + 0.7) full-time education award equivalents.

Unlike Hannah from Example 1, Kevin cannot earn the full \$5,176.50 education award of the TQT position, because he cannot earn more than 2 full-time education award equivalents in his lifetime. If he enrolls for the 2025-2026 service year, his education award will be:

 $2.0 - 1.9 = 0.1 \times \$7,395.00 = \739.50

\$739.50 is notably less than what a Minimum-Time (MT) member would normally get for an education award (\$1,565.08). Still, Kevin must complete all 1,200 hours of the TQT position and exit the program successfully to be awarded the \$739.50 amount. When Kevin enrolls for his 4th service term, he will be asked to log into the MyAmeriCorps portal to acknowledge and accept the partial education award amount.



Education Award Limitations

There are limitations on the number of terms an individual can serve in AmeriCorps State and National programs, such as Green Iowa AmeriCorps, and on the maximum number of education awards one individual can earn.


Currently, an individual serving in an AmeriCorps State and National program can only serve 4 terms <u>and</u> cannot earn more than the aggregate value of two full-time education awards.

Starting with the 2025-2026 service term, an individual serving in AmeriCorps can serve for the number of terms needed to earn the aggregate value of two full-time education awards <u>or</u> for 4 terms, whichever is longer.

Completing a FT, TQT, RHT, or MT term and earning an education award counts as 1 term when determining term limitations. Once you earn an award, the dollar amount of that award does not change.




Education Award Limitations: What it is right now





Education Award Limitations: Starting in 2025-2026



Does the award expire?

Yes, seven (7) years from the date in which it was awarded (end date of service).

You don't have to use it all at once. You can send any amount from \$1.00 to 100% of the cumulative amount awarded to you.

Use it or lose it – August 2032 will be here before you know it!



Applying for an Education Award Extension

There are certain circumstances where you are able to extend your education award's use period beyond the 7 years.

One of those circumstances is if you served another term of national service during the use period of a previous education award already earned.

A lot of our members do serve multiple terms of service. Two terms. Three terms.




Applying for an Education Award Extension

Shawn completed three terms with Green lowa:

- 1. Minimum-Time (5/2018 8/2018)
- 2. Full-Time (9/2018 8/2019)
- 3. Full-Time (9/2019 8/2020)

And still hasn't done anything with any of the education awards. As of July 2025, August 2018 was almost 7 years ago, and so the education award from Shawn's first term was about to expire.

So, Shawn applied for an award extension.



If you get to 6 years after your service term ended and you still haven't touched your education award, you will be given the option to <u>request an award extension</u> in your MyAmeriCorps portal.







Applying for an Education Award Extension

Because Shawn requested the award extension within his MyAmeriCorps portal, AmeriCorps already knew that Shawn completed two subsequent AmeriCorps terms. Therefore, his request was granted instantly.

The education award that Shawn earned during his first term of service back in August 2018 now expires when the education award from his third service term expires (August 2027), which is a 2-year / 2-term extension.



But, don't worry, Shawn plans to use these things well before then!

- You can use your education award to pay off qualified federal student loans. Examples of qualified loans:
 - Loans backed by the federal government under Title IV of the Higher Education Act:
 - Stafford Loans, Perkins Loans,
 Supplemental Loans to Students (SLS),
 Federal Consolidated Loans, Federally
 Insured Student Loans (FISL), William
 D. Ford Federal Direct Loans, National
 Defense Student Loans, Direct Stafford
 Loans, Direct Consolidation Loans
- Notably missing from the above list: Parent PLUS Loans to parents of students.



- You can use your education award to pay off qualified federal student loans. Examples of qualified loans:
 - Loans under Title VII and Title VIII of the Public Service Health Act:
 - Health Education Assistance Loans (HEAL), Health Professions Student Loans (HPSL), Nursing Student Loans (NSL), Primary Care Loans (PCL), and Loans for Disadvantaged Students



- You can use your education award to pay off qualified federal student loans. Examples of qualified loans:
 - Any loan determined by an institution of higher education to be necessary to cover a student's cost of attendance at such institution and made directly to a student by a state agency (includes state institutions of higher education)

If you don't know if your loans are qualified, ask the entity that holds your loan.






Private loans (e.g., from the local bank) do not qualify and cannot be paid off with your Education Award.

Also, you cannot use your Education Award to pay an old debt to a school, such as an outstanding tuition bill, that you incurred before your AmeriCorps service term.

In your MyAmeriCorps portal, you can direct your education award towards your <u>loan provider</u>.







If your loan provider is not listed when you search for them, do not panic.

You will need to suggest them to AmeriCorps.

<u>Important</u>: Any amount of payment sent to your loan provider is, by default, considered future payments, unless you call them and tell them otherwise.

- Advancing your payments (what they default to)
 - Your loan provider will pay ahead as many of your loan payments as your education award will cover.
 - o This option allows you to postpone payments for as long as possible, so that you can take a break from paying back your student loans.
 - Example: If you send \$1,500 and your loan payment is \$300, your loan provider will assume you are making 5 payments in advance.



There is another option instead of future payments:

- Paying down the principal:
 - This option allows you to apply your education award towards the principal of the loan rather than advancing the payments.
 - This will reduce your loan balance, so you pay less over the life of the loan and have a lower monthly payment amount.
 - The downside is you don't get a break from making student loan payments.

You must contact your loan provider, if you want your education award applied to the principal of the loan. Keep notes and records of who you talked to and when. Ask your loan provider to send you written confirmation of your request and follow up if necessary.



You can use your education award to pay for current or future costs of attendance at a <u>Title IV school</u>.


- <u>Title IV School</u>: Any higher education institution that currently participates in the US Department of Education's Title IV student aid programs. Includes most post-secondary colleges, universities, and technical schools.
- <u>Costs of Attendance</u>: May include things like tuition, books, fees, room and board, transportation, or other educational expenses.

Important: Each Title IV school's financial aid office determines what costs of attendance are defined as. Therefore, it is important to be in contact with them and ask if the education award can be used to pay for those expenses.



Also Important: If you withdraw from a school where you have used the education award, the school may be required to refund the National Service Trust.

If any refund is owed, it is credited back to your education award account in your MyAmeriCorps portal and is subject to the award's original expiration date.





How do I know if a school is Title IV? A few ways:

- Ask them! Ask the financial aid office if the school is a Title IV institution.
- Learn if students who attend the school are eligible to use Pell Grants, Perkins Loans, or Stafford Loans to attend the school. If students can, it is a Title IV school.
- The US Department of Education updates the list of Title IV schools 4 times a year:

If you are paying for education expenses like future tuition, before sending a part of your education award to your school:

- Make sure you were accepted by that school.
- Make sure that school is a Title IV institution.
- Call the school's financial aid office to let them know you have the education award and want to use it.
 - Tell them how much you are sending and that the education award will be split into two equal payments: Half at the beginning and half in the middle of the semester.
 - Ask if the award can be used for **costs of attendance expenses** and, if so, which ones.
 - Tell them you don't want your education award to be used against you by reducing your **overall financial aid package**. Ask them how to prevent that.

Creating an Education Award Payment Request

When you are ready to send all or a portion of your education award to your Title IV institution or loan provider, you will log into your MyAmeriCorps portal. In the Menu on the left part of the screen, go to "My Education Award" and click on "Create Education Award Payment Request".

Creating an Education Award Payment Request


Then, you will **choose the "Payment Type" from the drop-down menu**. Your two choices are "**Education Expenses**" (*current and future education expenses*) or "**Loan Payment**" (*past education expenses*).



If you choose "Education Expenses," the screen will re-load and ask for:

- 1. The semester/term you wish to apply the payment to.
- 2. The amount you wish to be directly dispersed to your Title IV institution.

You will then need to click on the red "Search for Institutions" link to choose where to send the money.



Type in the name of your Title IV institution. Once it comes up, click the red text of the institution's name, and it will auto-fill into your request.

Search Institutions

To search for an institution use any or all of the fields below and click the search button. Hints:

- When searching for a school, try searching by state first for best results, but try more than one possibility if nothing comes up.
- When searching for a loan holder, enter the first letter of the name (there may be more than one version of it; for example, AES and American Educational Service). Loan holders may have multiple addresses in this system, (for example, Navient has a commercial address in Pennsylvania and a Department of Education loan address in Georgia).



- 1. Make sure you have already spoken with someone at your Title IV institution to make sure they know the disbursement will be coming.
- 2. **Check all 4 boxes** under "Certify and Submit".

Using the Education Award: Current & Future Education Expenses

Certain Title IV institutions of higher education award AmeriCorps alums for your service by providing certain types of benefits such as:

- Tuition matching of the education award.
- Priority admission, in-state tuition, discounted tuition (e.g., paying 50%), academic credit, certain scholarships or fellowships.

These Title IV institutions are called **Schools of National Service**

Schools of National Service

Search the list below for schools that offer scholarships, application fee waivers, and other benefits for AmeriCorps alums. The following states offer in-state tuition to AmeriCorps alumni: Arizona, Maryland, and Nebraska. The State University System of New York, which includes 64 colleges and universities, waives the application fee for all AmeriCorps alumni.





Using the Education Award: Current & Future Education Expenses

The University of Northern lowa Center for Energy and Environmental Education is one School of National Service

The University of Northern Iowa will provide the following matching incentives to all AmeriCorps alumni who successfully complete a term of service. Waive the application fee for any AmeriCorps alumni who have successfully completed a service term of any length. The University will provide a \$1,000 scholarship (one-year/non-renewable) for up to 10 Segal Education Award recipients per year. More scholarships may be available based on the discretion of the University.



Other Post-AmeriCorps Service Benefits: Requesting Accrued Interest Payments

In addition to your education award, another post-service benefit available to AmeriCorps members is having the National Service Trust pay interest payments that accrued for qualified federal education loans you placed and were accepted into National Service Forbearance during your service term.

For qualified federal education loans that you placed (and were accepted) into National Service

Forbearance during your service term, the National Service Trust will pay all or a portion of the interest
you accrued on those qualified loans. The portion is determined by your slot type (e.g., full-time,
three-quarter-time, reduced-half-time, minimum-time, etc.). Accrued interest payments are in addition to





Other Post-AmeriCorps Service Benefits: Requesting Accrued Interest Payments

In your MyAmeriCorps portal, this option only becomes **available at the end of your service**. You must have a **successful exit** from the program.


 If you leave or are exited from the program before completing all your service requirements, you are marked as an unsuccessful exit. In this case, the National Service Trust will not pay all or a portion of the interest that accrued on qualified loans, even if you placed those loans into National Service Forbearance.

<u>Also important</u>: You must make your interest accrual payment request **BEFORE** you use the entire balance of your education award, or you will forfeit your ability to request accrued interest payments.



Other Post-AmeriCorps Service Benefits: Requesting Accrued Interest Payments

- In your MyAmeriCorps portal, under My Education Award, click on Create Interest Payment Request.
- 2. Select **Term of Service**.
- 3. Search for your institution
 - A. The institution is the entity that holds your loan in National Service Forbearance.
 - B. You must know the **EXACT** name and address of your loan provider.
- 4. Provide your account number in the Comments box.
- 5. Click the **Submit** button **ONCE**.



Tax Implications

Both your education award and any accrued interest payments made on your behalf by the National Service Trust <u>are considered taxable</u> <u>income</u> for both federal and many state tax returns in the year the payments were made.


- <u>Exception</u>: lowa and many other states do not currently consider your education award or accrued interest payments made on your behalf taxable income on your state tax return.
- Please check with <u>vour state</u>'s department of revenue and ask.



Tax Implications: Important Things to Keep in Mind

If the total sum of education award and interest payments is at least \$600 for the tax year, you will receive a 1099-MISC income form from AmeriCorps at the address in your MyAmeriCorps portal (keep this updated!). The 1099-MISC form will also be available in the MyAmeriCorps portal.

<u>Note</u>: According to the IRS, even if the sum of your education award and interest payments is less than \$600 and you don't have a 1099-MISC form sent to you, you are still obligated to report any amount as income of your taxes.

Tax Implications: Adjusting Iowa State Tax Return

- Step 5, Gross Income: Your Segal AmeriCorps Education Award payment was included in your federal taxable income, so it will be included in your Iowa taxable income in Step 5.
- Step 6, Adjustments to Income: You must enter the amount of your Segal AmeriCorps
 Education Award payments (including interest) on <u>LINE 24 "Other Adjustments."</u> This
 will result in these payments being deducted from your taxable income.



Study-Abroad Programs


Alums have been able to enroll in study-abroad programs through universities and pay for their programs through the school.





Daniel would like to go to Iowa State (not currently a School of National Service...)

- 1. Daniel looks at the list of matching institutions to see if lowa State will match his education award. (It won't...)
- 2. Daniel schedules an appointment with his financial aid officer and explains the Segal AmeriCorps Education Award.
 - a. The award will come in 2 payments (at the beginning and in the middle of the semester. Just like many scholarships.)
 - b. He double checks that lowa State is a **Title IV school**.
- 3. Daniel goes to his MyAmeriCorps portal.
- 4. He submits an educational payment request.
- 5. He waits for the school to accept that payment.



Jane wants to buy **textbooks** with her education award.

- Jane schedules an appointment with her financial aid officer and explains the Segal AmeriCorps Education Award.
 - a. She must ask, "Can I use my education award to pay for costs of attendance items like textbooks or a laptop?"
 - b. If they say yes, they may require Jane to purchase those textbooks or laptop at the school's bookstore. This is completely up to the school and their policies.
- Jane goes to her MyAmeriCorps portal.
- She submits an educational payment request.
- She waits for the school to accept the payment.





Common mistakes of education award payments:

- Not a Title IV institution
- School rejects the payment, because they do not recognize the funds (Member was not in communication with the financial aid office...)
- Sent the whole award even though only a small amount was required.
- Forgets to speak with the financial aid office to see if Costs of Attendance covers non-tuition costs.





Shae would like to pay off student loans.

- 1. Shae makes sure the loans are qualified federal student loans.
- 2. They locate the name and address of their loan provider, not the school they attended using the loan money.
- 3. Shae goes to their MyAmeriCorps portal and directs money towards the entity that holds their loans.
- 4. Shae checks every week or so to make sure the loan payment has gone through.
- 5. If there is an issue, Shae may need to call their loan provider to address the issue.



Common mistakes:

- Loan does not qualify for repayment (not a qualified federal student loan)
- Payment was sent to the wrong address or loan provider.
- Loan provider was confused and rejected the payment.





Transferring Your Education Award

Applicable to those who are 55+ at the time of signing their AmeriCorps service agreement.

- Can only be transferred to a child, stepchild, grandchild, step-grandchild, or foster child.
- The selected beneficiary has 10 years to use the award from the date when the transferring individual completed their service term.
- The transferred education award counts towards the beneficiary's lifetime limit of 2 full-time education award equivalents.
- Members can initiate a transfer request through their MyAmeriCorps portal.
- Transferring your award is the most complicated option.
