Big Brown Bat

This bat camouflages as leaves fluttering in the wind by hanging from one foot

Little Brown Bat

Known to roost on bearded lichens (usnea trichodea)

Eastern Red Bat

First bat to be listed as Endangered in the US

Indiana Bat

This bat hunts with a call that is too soft and high frequency for moths to hear, making them successful predators

**Evening Bat** 

This bat prefers to hunt aquatic insects along stream corridors

**Hoary Bat**
