Anticipated service schedule for this host site is 8:00am – 4:30pm four days a week, with a one-hour lunch. Schedule flexible depending on individual and organizational needs, with occasional nights and weekends as projects require.

Host Site Overview: Whiterock Conservancy is a non-profit land trust that stewards over 5,500 acres and 40 miles of trails in West-Central Iowa near Coon Rapids. The gorgeous Whiterock landscape attracts visitors from all over and spans oak savanna, rolling pastures, remnant and restored prairies, wetlands, the Middle Raccoon River, sandstone bluffs, fishing ponds, cropland, and unique historic and geologic sites. Whiterock Conservancy was founded in 2004 with the mission to achieve a sustainable, resilient rural landscape, and transform people's connection with agriculture and nature. <u>https://www.whiterockconservancy.org/</u>

Green lowa AmeriCorps member service activities support all aspects of Whiterock's mission, across conservation, sustainable agriculture, recreation, and education. Duties span from the office to the field, including helping with land stewardship and research projects, assisting visitors, working with volunteer groups, putting on public programs, creating content, and building organizational capacity. Daily tasks vary based on the service member's focus area as well as operational priorities. Service members have the option to live onsite in shared housing.

Position: Land Operations Support

Position Outline: This is primarily a field-based position, focusing on the maintenance and improvement of Whiterock's trail system, ecosystems, and infrastructure. The Land Operations Support member will also assist with various public-facing tasks, such as events, equipment rentals, tours, and educational programs. They will take direction from Whiterock's Land Operations Manager as well as other staff members, as appropriate. Because of the nature of their position, the Land Operations Support member must be comfortable working both independently and in a group setting, traversing steep terrain and performing physically rigorous tasks—sometimes in inclement weather—and interacting with diverse visitors and volunteers. If you are looking for foundational experience across a variety of fields, this is a great opportunity to get it!

Member Duties:

• Help maintain and improve Whiterock's land, infrastructure, and equipment. This includes but is not limited to trails, habitat, pasture, row crop, and guest facilities like campgrounds

- Support land management projects and activities, such as prescribed burns, invasive species mitigation, monitoring and assessment, research, and mapping
- Facilitate volunteer projects, public programs, and various events
- Provide assistance to trail users, campers, and other Whiterock guests
- Cultivate a positive team dynamic and public presence
- Participate in on- and offsite training and learning opportunities, sharing outcomes with Whiterock staff and applying skills and concepts gleaned

Position: Education & Outreach Support

Position Outline: This position will have a wide variety of duties ranging from the office to the field. They will primarily help with public outreach and support, from content generation to guest facilities maintenance, but will also be expected to pitch in with land management projects as needed. Accordingly, the Education & Outreach Support member will gain experience across fields, including education, event planning and management, public relations, outdoor recreation, and land stewardship. They will take direction from Whiterock's Guest Experience Manager as well as other staff members, as appropriate. Because of the nature of their position, the Education & Outreach Support member must be fairly tech savvy, comfortable interacting with diverse visitors and volunteers, and willing to perform physically rigorous tasks, sometimes in inclement weather. - Create and publish educational and promotional content. Platforms include but are not limited to Whiterock's website and blog, newsletters, e-blasts, and social media; local newspapers; and radio

- Facilitate volunteer projects, public programs and outreach, and other events
